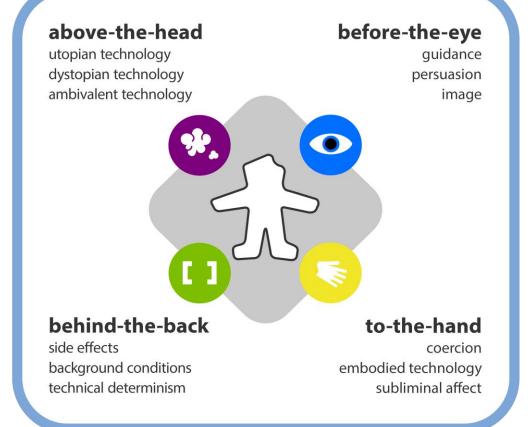

First point of interaction: 'Above the head'

- Consider what your assumptions and beliefs around AI technology.
- Dystopian, utopian, ambivalence, technosolutionism, dataism, etc.





Second point of interaction: 'behind the back'

Type 1: Background condition: Map the physical and organizational infrastructure that maintain AI.

Example: OpenAI Used Kenyan
Workers on Less Than \$2 Per Hour to
Make ChatGPT Less Toxic

Other conditions: data, earth, etc.

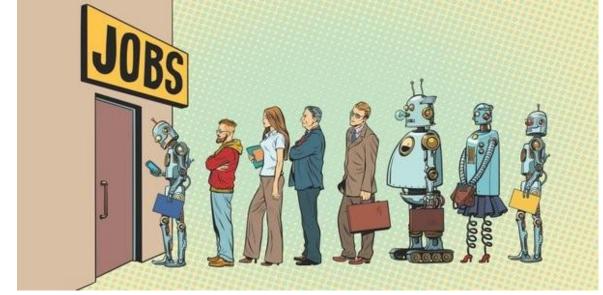




Second point of interaction: 'behind the back'

Type 2: Side-effects: Unintended consequence of using AI

- Examples:
- job displacement





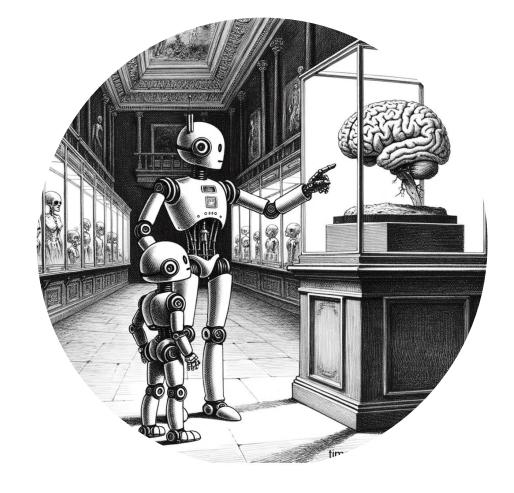
Second point of interaction: 'behind the back'

Type 3: Technical determinism: the feeling of being controlled by AI or AI's out of human's control

Example:

Black-box system of AI

The sudden emergence of ChatGPT





Third point of interaction: 'to the hand'

Coercion: An AI product enforces a certain behavior or habit.

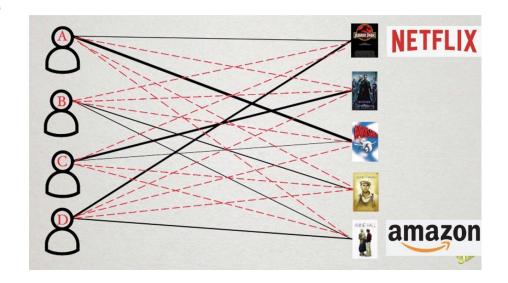
Example: smart home system: Automate and control lighting, heating, ventilation system etc to enforce energy saving behavior.





Third point of interaction: 'to the hand'

- Hyper Nudging: changing the underlying choice architecture
- Example: Netflix personalized recommendation system





Fourth point of interaction: 'before the eye'

- Explore how AI technologies signal to individuals and how these signs inform decision making or action.
- First type: Guidance: Give users instructions about possible use.



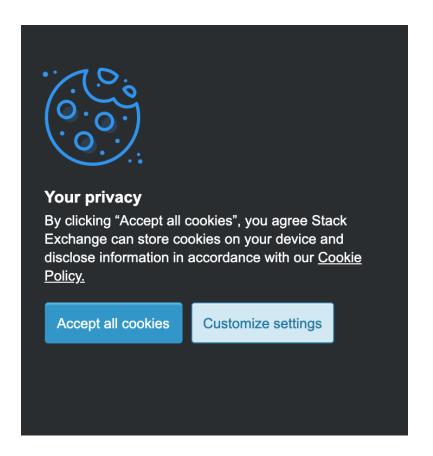
